There are 6 departments, 17 courses, 1301 students (UG 737, PG 564) and 145(80+65) staff.

Changes in the Administrative Team

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Departmental Activities

All the six departments are functioning very efficiently under the leadership of their HoD's. Our teachers are very dedicated and efficient in completing the lessons well in advance and conducting internal exams in time. All the departments have conducted De buds programme to welcome and initiate the new comers to the new courses. For this purpose, they are given motivation classes, bridge courses etc.











Besides the curricular activities all the departments organize other activities to prepare the students industry ready through add on courses, Fests and Department clubs and associations: Innovison and De Technista of CS PG, Agora and Daksh of Management, SADESS and Denovo of MSW, Club beta and Divario of Commerce, Technoriders and Luminous of CS UG and AVAS(Academy of Visual Arts and Sciences) and OPUS (Media and Literary Fest) of Multimedia and Communication. Though there exists a collaboration with De Paul University Chicago, our students had never been that side for student exchange programme. I am happy to inform you that this time five of our students with one faculty from De Paul School of Management had been to Chicago for a two week programme. The department has also organized an international conference with theme "Triple Bottom Line for Sustainability: Role of Government, Corporate and Non Profit Sector" in collaboration with De Paul University Chicago.

Social Commitment

Following the example of our heavenly patron St. Vincent De Paul, we give special attention to our commitment to the wider society. Every department arranges some outreach programme to bring student in direct contact with the urgent problems of the environment, the poor an d suffering. Rural camps and visit to charitable homes are also arranged in order to inculcate compassion for the poor in the minds of the students. MSW had organized Jingle Bells a Christmas programme for special children, Computer Science (PG): awareness class on blood DR. UNNY CJ

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and stem cell donation, Computer Science(UG) awareness programme on cancer and initiated hair donation campaign, Commerce department organized a seminar on organ donation and School of Management invited a foot and mouth artist for its curtain raiser. All department organized visits to the homes for the poor, the sick and the mentally and physically challenged. Some departments organized rural camps also.





Two units of NSS also are actively functioning in DiST and it has organized rural camp celebration of Yoga Day, Gandhi Jayanthi, blood donation camps etc.



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


Placement



In this year we already have number of placements in all the departments. In the recently passes out MCA and MSc batch 80% of the students got placement. On this occasion I express my gratitude to the placement coordinator, director and all the placement officers of all the departments for their service in placement activities.












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De Paul Centre for Research and Development(DCRD) and De Paul Extension Service(DES)

DES has initiated a project on combating climate change as a part of our institutional social responsibility.

Value Education Classes

There are three student counsellors, two full time and one-part time, appointed to help the students. We had arranged two retreats for students in the month of August.

Faculty Development Programme (FDP)

Staff members are encouraged to participate in different faculty development programme either in DiST or in other colleges.





We have a library with 16400 books, 37 journals, 41 periodicals more than 3000 e-journals and online data bases such as Pro-Quest and DELNET. In order to foster reading habit among students we have conducted Current Awareness Test and easy competitions in connection with reading day.

As part of encouraging sports and games we have formed a Volley ball team and also upgraded the court. Our team has already won different tournaments. Our team has reached the quarter final of the MGU championship.


