With a heart full of gratitude towards God Almighty and invoking the prayers of our Patron Saint St Vincent De Paul and the Servant of God Fr Varkey Kattarath, I present the annual report of De Paul Institute of Science & Technology for the year 2021-22. The college was started in the year 2002 with just one Programme. But it has now grown to an institution imparting education to around 1400 students spread over eight undergraduate and eight post graduate programmes in seven departments.

Because of the third wave of Covid 19 lock down in Kerala, colleges were again on the online mode of teaching, which affected the regular offline activities in the campus. However, college was opened for regular offline classes from October 2021 onwards even though with a lot of restrictions on the number of students in the class room, social distancing and other covid protocols. In spite of these constraints, the different departments in the college excelled in their activities related to teaching learning process and other co-curricular and extracurricular activities.

College Union

Due to covid lockdown and consequent online classes, the university conducted the college union elections as late as 15th March, 2022. In DiST, elections were conducted in the parliamentary system and the following students were elected as the office bearers. Skill development programme was given by School of Professional Development to M Com 21 and B Com 21 batches. Placement Training Programme was given to M Com 21 and B Com 20 batch by Tally and to B Com19 batch by Synergen Group. In the School of Management, Revive – The placement training of School of Management was conducted in two phases -in the month of October 2021 and April 2022, 60 hour aptitude training by the TIME was given to the final year students and two

grooming sessions on grooming, one by Ms. Preethy Nair and another one by Ms. Nisha Jose were given.

Placements

As in previous years DiST has managed to give placement offers to many students through its placement cell. In the School of Computer Science UG, final year students received 46 offers of jobs. In the School of Management, a total of 32 students got placed from MBA MHRM 2019 batch with an average CTC of 2.71 Lakhs and 25 students from MBA MHRM 2020 batch got placements with an average CTC of 5.9 Lakhs. In the School of English, six students got job offers. 85% of the MSW students got placements in the School of Social work. In the School of Computer Science PG, 42 students got placed.

DiST talent clubs were established to develop the latent talents of our students. Every club has faculty coordinators and student office bearers. Activities of these clubs were inaugurated on 1st November, the Kerala Piravi Day.

The dance club organized rhythm on reels competition, Tiruvathira kali and theme dance competition during the year. Debate and public speaking club released a video showing the purpose and activities of the club and organized a debate competition ‘DEBATTLE’ by name.
